

PATRICK KAVANACH I WRITER & POFT

Patrick Kavanagh is one of Irelands most beloved poets. He was born in Monaghan in 1904, the son of a cobbler and small farmer. He left school at thirteen to work on the land, but "dabbled in verse" with his early work printed in 1929. His first collection **Ploughman and Other Poems** was published in 1936 with his autobiography The Green Fool following in 1938. He moved to Dublin during the war where The Great Hunger was published in 1942. Two more volumes of verse. Soul for Sale and Come Dance with Kitty Stobling.

were published in 1947 and 1969 respectively. His novel Tarry Flynn was banned for a time when it was published in 1948. He died in 1967 and is buried in his native Inniskeen. Kavanagh remains one of the country's most acclaimed writers: when The Irish Times compiled a list of favourite Irish poems in 2000, ten of Kavanagh's poems were in the top 50.



CONAL MORRISON I PLAYWRIGHT

Conall Morrison is a director and playwright. His original production of **Tarry Flynn** had two runs in the Abbev Theatre and transferred to the National Theatre in London. As well as directing thirty shows for the Abbey Theatre, he has directed for the Royal Shakespeare Company, the Globe Theatre, English National Opera, Landmark Productions, Fishamble Theatre Company, the Lyric Theatre, Cameron Mackintosh. His work in 2021 included Strauss's Elektra for Irish National Opera, Colin Murphy's **The Treaty** for

Fishamble, Rosaleen Linehan's **Backwards up a Rainbow** for Landmark, and two RTÉ radio dramas: The United State vs Ulysses, and Strutting and Fretting.

AARON MONAGHAN I DIRECTOR & PRODUCER

Aaron is an award-winning Actor/Director from Cavan and Artistic Director of Livin' Dred Theatre Co, which he co-founded. He has performed numerous times with the company in productions such as **Emerald Germs** and **The Tinkers Curse**. His directing credits include **Ghost Light**, **Trad, Walking The Road, From All Sides, Slice-the Thief, Hitting The Mark** and the award-nominated **Charlie's A Clepto**.

He has received numerous awards for his work, including the Lucille Lortel Award, The Manchester Evening News Award, The Irish Times Theatre Award and The OBIE Award for Outstanding Performance.

Bryan trained in the Samuel Beckett Centre at Trinity
College Dublin. Noteworthy performances include My Foot/

Clown (Irish Times Theatre Award Best Supporting Actor
2009) and his self-penned one man show Beowulf: The
Blockbuster which has toured Ireland, Scotland, Wales,
France, Australia, New York, was the critics number one
success of the Edinburgh Fringe 2014 winning the Stage

Award for Acting Excellence.
